2023 Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes

Tax payments can be made by mail, drop box, online or at the Town Hall.

Please make check payable to **Town of Campbell Treasurer**. **Be sure to include your phone number on your check**. If you'd like a receipt, enclose a self-addressed, **stamped** envelope. Alternatively, tax payments can be seen at www.lacrossecounty.org, click on: "How Do I"> "Tax/Parcel Search"> "Taxes"

Tax payments must be made on a separate check from all other Town business payments.

- Place tax payments in the Town of Campbell drop box. Do not place cash in the drop box.
- Online payments can be made by going to: www.govpaynow.com and use PLC # a003ia. *Credit Card payments will be charged a processing fee.*

Sewer Rate Increase

The Campbell wastewater is treated at the La Crosse Wastewater Treatment Facility. A major upgrade of that plant is in progress with La Crosse investing about \$65,000,000. The Treatment Charges that Campbell pays La Crosse have been increasing the past few years and have been estimated to increase an additional 9% in 2024. Campbell is also continuing repairs and improvements to our collection system. To generate the revenue for those projects, the Campbell Sewer rates will increase to \$430 per REU (Residential Equivalent Unit) for 2024.

Animal Licensing

All dogs and cats over 5 months old must be licensed. Renewal is due by January 1st with a grace period no later than March 31st.

Expired rabies information must be updated before a tag will be issued. It is the animal owner's responsibility to provide this information. Renewals: Due January 1 each year

New Residents: License within 30 days

New adult dog/cat: License within 30 days

Puppies/kittens: License by 5 months of age

For new dogs/cats, you need to provide proof of rabies vaccination, dog/cat's name, breed, color, age/birthdate and sex. Owners need to provide name, address, phone number, and driver's license number.

Animal Fees:

Spayed/Neutered: \$12

Unaltered: \$23

Payments can be made by mail or by drop box. Please include a phone number and enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope so the tags can be mailed to you.

Please note that Town residents are limited to 2 dogs and 3 cats per household by Town Ordinance.
